COMMUNITY 1:1 MENTORING

- >> Mentor (Big): Adult volunteer (ages 18+)
- >> Mentee (Little): Child (ages 6-16)
- >> Structure: Outings in the community 2x per month
- >> Eligibility/Requirements: Live in Orange County; meet twice a month
- >> **Benefits:** Mentors provide children with social and emotional support to achieve their personal goals, the opportunity to try new experiences, and connections to social and economic advancement.

HIGH SCHOOL BIGS PEER MENTORING

- >> Mentor (Big): Peer volunteer (high school student)
- » Mentee (Little): Elementary school student
- >> Structure: Weekly after-school sessions; facilitated in a group setting
- >> Eligibility/Requirements: Student is enrolled at a participating school
- Benefits: Littles are able to build a friendship with a positive role model and someone they can relate and look up to. Bigs are able to find their voices as leaders, community advocates and philathropists

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

My elementary student is a Little in the Community program. Can they also be a Little in the High School Bigs program? No, a child may only be enrolled as a Little in one BBBS program at a time.

My high school student is a Little in the Community program. Can they be a Big in the High School Bigs program? Yes! If your teen's high school participates in our High School Bigs program, they may apply to volunteer as a peer mentor (Big) to an elementary school student. Contact lcain@ocbigs.org for more information.

My child is a Little in the High School Bigs program and will be entering middle school next year. How can they continue to receive the support of a mentor? Did you know that students who meet regularly with a mentor are 52% less likely than their peers to skip school, are 55% more likely to be enrolled in college, and, on average, earn 13% higher wages as an adult? By enrolling your 7th grader in our Community program, you ensure your child stays connected to a mentor. To apply, go to ocbigs.org/enroll.
