## PERSONAL SAFETY RULES

At BBBS, safety is our number one priority. Here are some of the site rules your child must follow:

- **Respectful Behavior**: Students are expected to show respect to their Bigs, peers, Program Specialist, and the material at all times.
- No Exchange of Contact Info: For the safety of all participants, students are strictly prohibited from exchanging personal contact info with their Big, such as phone numbers or social media profiles.
- Additionally, meeting outside of the supervised mentoring sessions is NOT permitted.

## *5*9 PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN

Throughout the year, your child and their Big will work on a Youth Outcome Development Plan (YODP) to help achieve their goals.

Our proven curriculum includes activities that focus on:

- Increasing confidence
- Building social skills
- Learning self-regulation
- Future planning and exploration
- Creating stronger relationships

Each week, your child and their Big will work on academics and participate in SEL activities, such as:

- All About Me: Bigs and Littles will engage in personal reflection, expression, and love by completing a worksheet about promotes self-awareness and a positive self-image.
- Slime: Matches explore their creativity and enjoy sensory play through everyone's favorite, slime!
- Career Day: Matches will explore different types of exciting career possibilities for their future.

**High School Bigs** is a peer-to-peer mentoring program that connects your child (Little) with a high school student (Big) who serves as their friend and role model. Matches meet once a week after school at the elementary school. During this session, facilitated by a Big Brothers Big Sisters Program Specialist, matches spend time working on academics, building social and personal skills, and developing a friendship.





#### Tax Preparation - Tax Deadline: April 15, 2024

OC Free Tax prep is part of OC United Way's United for Financial Security initiative, which offers eligible households with income of \$100,000 or less to file their taxes at no charge. With 25 locations throughout the county, families are able to have an IRS-Certified volunteer tax preparer help them file their taxes. Sites open starting the first week in February, and services are offered in multiple languages, including English, Spanish, Vietnamese, and Korean. The app connects young people with professional coaches, self-guided tools, digital journaling, a peer community, and more—at no cost to youth or their families.
